COST OF LIVING CRISIS HERE CAN I GET HE



YOUR COUNCILLOR RICHARD BENNETT

Richard knows that a lot of residents are worried about how to pay their gas and electricity bills. In the longer term we need to increase the amount of renewable energy produced, and we urgently need to make homes and businesses much more energy efficient. But, right now, many people need help to pay bills that are going through the roof.

INFORMATION FROM COUNCIL

Go to Richmond Council's Cost of Living Hub:

richmond.gov.uk/services/cost of living hub/cost of living bills It has information about fuel grants, winter fuel payments and the Warm Homes discount scheme. You can then call the Council on 020 8891 1411 and ask for the department you need.

MONEY TOWARDS ENERGY BILLS

The Government is giving £150 to all households in Council Tax Band A-D properties (or Band E with disabled band reduction). This is known as the Council Tax Energy Rebate. Households who did not apply by the deadline of 31st October will not miss out - Richmond has credited the £150 directly to their Council Tax Account. See:

richmond.gov.uk/services/council tax/energy rebate payments There is also the Government Energy Support Scheme (see www.gov.uk/guidance/getting-the-energy-bills-supportscheme-discount) where all eligible households should be given £400 towards their energy bills.

HELP WITH KEEPING WARM & SAVING ENERGY

Contact the South West London Energy Advice Partnership (SWLEAP). SWLEAP provides energy advice to anyone struggling with energy bills. This could be an energy visit to your home but they also provide advice at energy cafes in community settings, over the telephone or by email if you prefer.



ADDRESSING THE HOUSING CRISIS

Earlier this month Richard led a council debate on whether LBRUT should radically change our social housing approach (build our own again) to address our shortage of family homes for rent. Green Party Councillor Caroline Wren also proposed a Motion, which was passed Unanimously to provide private renters with greater support and protection of their rights.

TWICKENHAM RIVERSIDE LATEST

The winning design for redeveloping the Twickenham Riverside site, arrived at after a lengthy consultation process, has been approved by the Planning Committee subject to a legal decision on the Compulsory Purchase Order of the Diamond Jubilee Gardens site. Needless to say, the final design will never completely satisfy everyone, but Richard believes it's high time that this was moved forward.
